#### Section 4. First aid measures

#### **Description of necessary first aid measures**

**Eye contact**

#### Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

#### Precautions for safe handling

Whether the chemicals are classified by NFPA or not, anyone using the 704 systems to classify chemicals does so at their own risk.
