2. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

Regulatory Status

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Description of First Aid Measures

Eye contact

- Rinse immediately with plenty of water, also under the eyelids, for at least 15 minutes
- DO NOT rub or scratch eyes
- If eye irritation persists: Get medical advice/attention
- Rinse thoroughly with plenty of water, also under the eyelids
- If symptoms persist, call a physician

Skin contact

- · Wash off immediately with soap and plenty of cold water
- DO NOT use warm water because this will open up the pores of the skin, which will cause

further penetration of fibers and dust

- · Use a wash cloth to help remove fibers and dust
- DO NOT rub or scratch affected area
- Remove contaminated clothing and shoes
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- If skin irritation persists, call a physician
- If fibers are seen penetrating from the skin, the fibers can be removed by applying and removing adhesive tape so that the fibers adhere to the tape and are pulled out of the skin
- Never use compressed air to remove fibers from skin
- · Wash off immediately with plenty of water

Inhalation

- Remove to fresh air
- · If symptoms persist, call a physician

Ingestion

- Accidental ingestion of this product is unlikely
- Rinse mouth with water and drink water to remove fibers from the throat
- If this does occur watch person for several days to make sure intestinal blockage does not occur
- · If symptoms persist, call a physician

Protective equipment and precautions for firefighters

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal precautions

· Avoid contact with eyes and skin

Methods for cleaning up

- Use an industrial vacuum cleaner with a high efficiency filter to clean up dust and fiber contamination
- · Avoid dry sweeping
- Pick up and transfer to properly labeled containers
- · Use personal protective equipment as required
- Cover powder spill with plastic sheet or tarp to minimize spreading and keep powder dry
- Take up mechanically, placing in appropriate containers for disposal
- Avoid creating dust
- Clean contaminated surface thoroughly

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7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Precautions for safe handling • Prevent and/or minimize dust formation

· Do not breathe dust

• Wear appropriate personal protective equipment in case of direct contact with the product

Storage Conditions • Keep product in packaging until use to minimize potential dust generation

Product should be kept dry and undercover

of respiratory disease

NTP (National Toxicology Program) In June 2011, The National Toxicology Program (NTP) removed biosoluble glass wool

fibers from its list of possible carcinogens used for home and building insulation
